One Year Work Placement



student's perspective

- A student will typically go out on placement between their penultimate and final year
- Minimum 38 weeks, maximum 12 months (could be two six month placements)
- Students are responsible for finding and securing their own placement
- The placement must clearly contribute to student's degree programme
- Students will pay a reduced fee for the year they spend on placement
- The placement year is assessed on a pass/fail basis
- Students who successfully complete the placement year are awarded an amended degree title to reflect this, for example "BSc (Hons) Degree with Employment Experience"



One Year Work Placement



perspective

- Commence any time from late June to September
- Students will need to be paid a salary (guidance on appropriate salary levels is available)
- The University requires the student to be issued with a contract of employment detailing the terms and conditions of the their employment
- Employers are required to complete a three-way agreement with the student and the University
- A Health and Safety questionnaire must be completed prior to the placement commencing
- International (non-EU) students are eligible to undertake a placement year
